

As part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the U.S. Department of Energy is providing funding to states and territories to support consumer rebate programs for ENERGY STAR qualified appliances. Under these programs, consumers can receive rebates to purchase energy-efficient appliances when they replace used appliances. Eligibility guidelines, covered products, and rebate amounts differ by state, so consumers should review program requirements carefully.



## NEW JERSEY

New Jersey Office of Clean Energy/Board of Public Utilities

### REBATES AVAILABLE

**Rebates for eligible boilers, furnaces, and propane water heaters stated on February 1, 2010. Rebates for refrigerators, clothes washers, dishwashers, central air conditioners, air source heat pumps, and ground source heat pumps began on April 1, 2010. Rebates for electric heat pump and solar gas backup water heaters began on April 9, 2010. The rebates for clothes washers, dishwashers, refrigerators, and refrigerator recycling previously closed on April 30, 2010 will start again on July 1, 2010 and will end on August 1, 2010 or when funds are depleted. BOILERS	Oil	ENERGY STAR qualified. The Annual Fuel Utilization Efficiency (AFUE) must be at least 85%.	\$300
	Propane	ENERGY STAR qualified. The Annual Fuel Utilization Efficiency (AFUE) must be at least 85%.	\$300
FURNACES	Oil	ENERGY STAR qualified. The Annual Fuel Utilization Efficiency (AFUE) must be at least 85%.	\$300
	Propane	Has an Annual Fuel Utilization Efficiency (AFUE) of at least 92%.*	\$300
WATER HEATERS	Propane Storage	ENERGY STAR qualified. Has an Energy Factor (EF) of at least 0.62.	\$25
	Propane Tankless	ENERGY STAR qualified. Has an Energy Factor (EF) of at least 0.82.	\$300

PHASE 2: Began April 1, 2010. Rebates for clothes washers, refrigerators, refrigerators, and refrigerator recycling that previously closed on April 30, 2010 will reopen on July 1. See PHASE 4 for details.

## ENERGY STAR STATE APPLIANCE REBATE PROGRAM: **NEW JERSEY**

HEAT PUMPS	Air-Source	Both split systems and single-package equipment must have a heating seasonal performance factor of at least 8.5, a Seasonal Energy Efficiency Ratio (SEER) of at least 14.5, and an Energy Efficiency Ratio (EER) of at least 12.*	\$300
	Ground-Source	ENERGY STAR qualified.	\$400

### PHASE 3: Began April 9, 2010.

WATER HEATERS	Electric Heat Pump	ENERGY STAR qualified.	\$250
	Solar, Gas Backup	ENERGY STAR qualified. Has a Solar Fraction (SF) of at least 0.5; must be SRCC OG-300 certified.	\$1,200

### PHASE 4: Scheduled to begin July 1, 2010.

Clothes Washers	ENERGY STAR qualified with a Modified Energy Factor (MEF) of 1.8 to 2.19 and a Water Factor (WF) not more than 7.5.	\$35
Dishwashers	ENERGY STAR qualified.	\$25
	Uses no more than 307 kWh per year. Uses no more than 5 gallons of water per cycle.*	\$50
Refrigerators	ENERGY STAR qualified.	\$75
	Annual kWh usage is at least 25% more efficient than the federal standard.	\$100
Recycling of Old Refrigerators	Proof of purchase of a new refrigerator during the program.	\$25

## HOW TO APPLY

Please allow up to 120 days from the date the New Jersey Clean Energy Program™ receives all required information to process your rebate. For clothes washer, dishwashers, and refrigerators, some retailers offer instant rebates at the time of purchase and others required applications to be sent by postal mail. Consumers have until September 15, 2010 to submit mailed rebate applications for clothes washers, dishwashers, and refrigerators. Rebates will be paid on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional information will be provided on the program sponsor Web site as it becomes available.

## ELIGIBILITY

Consumers must be residents of New Jersey. Consumers must be replacing an existing appliance. Additional recycling rebates require proof of purchase of a new refrigerator during the program period and proof of recycling the old, working refrigerator. Limit one rebate per product category per household. Rebates are subject to available funds. These rebates cannot be combined with the Clean Energy Program rebates for the same products.
