

As part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the U.S. Department of Energy is providing funding to states and territories to support consumer rebate programs for ENERGY STAR qualified appliances. Under these programs, consumers can receive rebates to purchase energy-efficient appliances when they replace used appliances. Eligibility guidelines, covered products, and rebate amounts differ by state, so consumers should review program requirements carefully.

REBATES AVAILABLE

Rebates for eligible furnaces and air-source heat pumps started on January 1, 2010. Rebates for clothes washers, dishwashers, refrigerators, electric heat pump water heaters, gas storage water heaters and gas tankless water heaters are scheduled to begin on July 1, 2010. Rebates may be offered for a limited time only. Before making a purchase, confirm funding, requirements, and other updates with the [program sponsor](#) listed in the HOW TO APPLY section.

Clothes Washers		ENERGY STAR qualified.	70% of purchase price up to \$800.
Dishwashers		ENERGY STAR qualified.	70% of purchase price up to \$400.
Refrigerators		ENERGY STAR qualified.	70% of purchase price up to \$700.

HOW TO APPLY

Consumers must contact their local Community Action Program (CAP) agency to participate. In most cases, with the exception of clothes washer and dishwashers, CAP agencies will use vouchers to purchase appliances on behalf of low-income households through existing appliance replacement programs.

Rebates will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis. Additional information will be provided on the program Web site as it becomes available.

ELIGIBILITY: LOW-INCOME

The appliance rebate program will be available to low-income Oregon residents who own their homes and whose income is at or below 60% of the State Median Income. Limit one rebate per product category per household. Consumers and installers will be responsible for removing and recycling old appliances in accordance with state laws.
