

As part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the U.S. Department of Energy is providing funding to states and territories to support consumer rebate programs for ENERGY STAR qualified appliances. Under these programs, consumers can receive rebates to purchase energy-efficient appliances when they replace used appliances. Eligibility guidelines, covered products, and rebate amounts differ by state, so consumers should review program requirements carefully.



## OREGON

Oregon Department of Energy

### REBATES AVAILABLE

Rebates for eligible furnaces and air-source heat pumps began January 1, 2010. Rebates for clothes washers, dishwashers, refrigerators, electric heat pump water heaters, gas storage water heaters and gas tankless water heaters began July 1, 2010. Available rebates will be distributed on a "first-come, first-served" basis. As of November 1, 2011, funds are very limited. New rebate vouchers are being distributed to qualifying low-income homeowners only as previously distributed vouchers expire. The program will end when funds are depleted. ## ELIGIBILITY: LOW-INCOME

The appliance rebate program will be available to low-income Oregon residents who own their homes and whose income is at or below 60% of the State Median Income. Limit one rebate per product category per household. Consumers and installers will be responsible for removing and recycling old appliances in accordance with state laws.
